

74TH. RANCHO SAN ANTONIO CAR SHOW AND FUNDRAISER EVENT

The Rancho San Antonio Boys Home held its 74th. Open house on October 3, 2021 at Chatsworth CA. It was open from 11Am to 4Pm that day.

The much anticipated event featured Chicken, Steak, Rib dinners, Classic Mexican food, the Rancho San Antonio Raffle and the well known Classic Chevy Car Club car show.

The highlight of the event was the raffle drawing of prizes set to raise the much needed source of funds for the Boys Home which include \$3,000 for first prize, \$2,000 for second prize and 10 prizes of \$100 each. The day also included the emplacement of the new statue of St. Anthony which was vandalized in late 2020 by decapitation of the structures that have long existed at the entrance gates of Rancho San Antonio Boys Home.

The history of Rancho San Antonio dates back to 1933, when the Catholic Big Brothers recognized the need for such an agency, where boys with problems might solve them under proper guidance. The present location at 21000 Plummer Street, Chatsworth was purchased by the Catholic Archdiocese of Los Angeles and officially opened on June 20, 1938.

In 1953, the Cardinal re-



quested that the Brothers of the Holy Cross assume direct supervision of the facilities and program at Rancho San Antonio. At this time, Cardinal McIntyre also requested the Southern California Chapter of the Knights of Columbus to assist with the muchneeded service for youth and their families. Through the years, the Knights of Columbus have raised over four million dollars funding the 17 facilities on the Rancho San Antonio Campus and assisting with the graduation of over 15,000 youth.


For the boys residing at Rancho, each boy's education, spiritual needs, social judgment, physical growth and counseling needs are given individual consideration. Rancho San Antonio provides various types of therapy-based programs for helping the individual find and maximize the strengths that he has as an individual. These programs seek to help youngsters define and recognize his problems, change his

attitudes into a responsible and acceptable manner.

Successful completion of the program is the ultimate goal. The boys at Rancho San Antonio are not incarcerated, as there are no walls or fences. Therefore each boy must be willing to accept his need for placemen and be willing to participate in working on his problems. We request the boy's family o actively participate in his growth toward responsible manhood.

Rancho San Antonio has received citation for its services from the State Legislator, the County of Los Angeles, and the City of Los Angeles. We also have the wholehearted endorsement from the Los Angeles Board of Education, the Department of Public Social Services, and the juvenile Court. Today, Rancho San Antonio is nationally accredited and is recognized as a leader in innovative programs for the youth

CHRISTMAS CHURCH CELEBRATIONS FOR 2021



Several celebrations were held honoring the Our Lady of Guadalupe in the localities of San Fernando Valley and Los Angeles.

The Our Lady of the Angels Cathedral in Los Angeles held its celebration on December 11 starting 4:15Pm with the Mass held at 12:00 midnight. The celebration was especially relevant since it honored a relic of the Our Lady of Guadalupe

where the Knights of Columbus Honor Guards were tasked to keep watch.

Similarly; the traditional Filipino Simbang Gabi were held at the Cathedral

on December 15, with the Color Guards assembled by 5:45Pm. Several other celebrations of the Simbang Gabi were held in various Parishes, around the world as a 9 days preparation for the coming of the birth of our Savior Jesus Christ

As part of the celebration; the readings are done in Tagalog, Filipino dialect including most

of the Mass proper. At the offeing, certain items are carried forward towards the altar on each of the 9 days; symbolizing the preparations being made for the birth of our Redeemer. A parade of lanterns is also a usual spectacle.

It has also been a commonplace practice for the Parishoners to be treated to a hearty breakfast, courtesy of the various lay organizations of the Parish Churches during the duration of the entire 9 days, culminating to December 25, where the Christmas Mass Celebration is highlighted with a well prepared breakfast by volunteers and contributors to the Christmas celebrations. The early morning ritual is said to have originated to accommodate farmers who wanted to attend Mass early in the morning as a 9 days Novena.

REDEDICATION AND EMPLACEMENT OF STATUES AT RANCHO SAN ANTONIO



On October 3, 2021; coinciding with the celebration of the 74th. Rancho San Antonio Fundraiser event, the new statue of San Antonio de Padua carrying the baby Jesus and welcoming a

young boy with a suitcase was installed and rededicated within the compound of the Rancho San Antonio Boys Home.

Sometime in June 2020, some van-

dals destroyed the statues of Saint Anthony, the child Jesus and the boy carrying a suitcase where their heads were intentionally knocked off in some fit misguided hatred. The statues have been a hall-mark of the Boys Home since 1953 when the Brothers of the Holy Cross assumed leadership of the Rancho along with the help of the Knights of Columbus.

Rancho has moved the remains onto the campus for safekeeping and the heads sent to Italy for re-sculpting. The statues with the newly sculpted heads have been emplaced in front of Rancho's administration building



INVINCIBLE MOTHER

On the morning of Nov 1 4 , 1921, Luciano Perez Carpio, an employee of the

Private Secretariat of the President in Mexico City, entered the Basilica of Our Lady or Guadalupe and placed a flower arrangement containing a bomb below the revered image. When the bomb ex-

ploded, it shattered nearby vases, damaged candlesticks and mysteriously bent an iron and bronze crucifix weighing close to 75 pounds, as if containing the blast. But Our Lady remained unscathed.

"They wanted to destroy the image of the Virgin of Guadalupe, but it was Jesus Christ, Our Lord who defended his mother," said Msgr. Eduardo Chavez, postulator of St. Juan Diego's cause for canonization and a canon at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The 1921 attack, he said,

was an "awful moment", but at the same time a God-filled moment," because it is a testimony to God's love.

Msgr. Chavez, who coauthored the book *Our Lady of Guadalupe: Mother of the Civilization of Love* with Past Supreme Knight Carl Anderson in 2009, recounts in further detail the story of the bombing in a new Spanish-language book titled La *persecucion desconocida contra la Inglesia Catolica* (The Unkonwn Persecution Against the Catholic Church).
