The James Francis Cardinal McIntyre Assembly formally celebrated its 65th year Anniversary with a Thanksgiving Mass held on May 2, 2021 at the St. Jane Frances de Chantal Church North Hollywood CA.

Assembly 65 was founded on August 15,

1955 after Joseph Wilson returned from the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council Convention held in Philadelphia and having obtained a Charter for the James Francis Cardinal McIntyre Assembly 65, instituting the patriotic 4th degree of the Knights of Columbus in the region.

Joseph Wilson was originally a member of the Los Angeles Council 621, the oldest Council in Los Angeles. He became Grand Knight of Glendale Council 1920, serving from 1946-47. He went on to help establish the Van Nuys Council, known then as the West Valley Council 3148. He would go on to serve as the fourth Grand Knight of West Valley Council from 1951-52. Later he would serve as District Deputy. In 1954, he was elected President of the Southern California Chapter. He was the First Faithful Navigator of the James Francis Cardinal McIntyre Assembly 65. He served in various Sate Chairman positions and was later

elected as California State Deputy from 1961-62.

The newly chartered Assembly comprised of San Fernando Valley, Antelope Valley Councils including Lancaster Council 2455; North Hollywood Council 2670; St. Cabrini Council 3472, Burbank; Our Lady of the Valley Council 3016; West Valley Council 3148, Van Nuys; Encino Council 3947 and Guardian Angel Council 3921, Sun Valley.

The Assembly was named after James Francis Alovsius McIntyre, a parish priest from New York City ordained in 1921. He was appointed Auxiliary Bishop of New York in 1940 and Installed as Archbishop of Los Angeles in 1948. He was named Cardinal by Pope Pius XII in 1953. Cardinal McIntyre opened 180 Catholic Schools. In 1952, he delivered the sermon at the opening of the Knights of Columbus Supreme Convention held in Los Angeles, CA.

He also dedicated 192 Churches, including 25 in the San Fernando Valley and 27 in Orange County, which did not become a separate Diocese until 1976.

The celebration of the 65th Anniversary of James Francis Cardinal McIntyre Assembly has been well received by dedicated support over the success of its fundraising campaign through a Virtual Souvenir Program book.

The Anniversary included guest speaker, District Master Ray Forgette, keynote speaker State Warden James Larson who represented State Deputy Steve Bolton who was sick at the time. A slide presentation was shown as well on the Assembly's history and events through the years. Awards were given to SK Teddy Ortega, SK Alex Quadra and SK Dennis Nodar for their significant efforts in support of the Virtual Souvenir Program campaign. Refreshments were served afterwards.

The Rancho San Antonio Boys Home is scheduled to hold an Open House and Raffle Ticket Sales scheduled for October 3, 2021.

After having been postponed the previous year due to the Covid 19 Pandemic, the fundraiser Campaign is now calendared to proceed with its Open House invitation. In previous years, Rancho San Antonio held its annual raffle along with a barbecue and a vintage car show, display-

ing some rare, vintage and properly restored car collections of the bygone era. There was also music, BBQ, model car exhibits and product booths. Done in connection with the Classic Chevy's of Southern California Car Club, the last car show featured its 36th Annual Car

Show in 2018. The annual event featured more than a hundred cars parked on the Rancho grounds.

This year, with restrictions on social distancing and limitations to crowd gatherings just getting eased, certainty as to its car show resumption is still up for approvals by the State and County. Nevertheless, the raffle fundraiser has been initiated, with raffle tickets being actively distributed to

the different KofC Councils to participate in its sales.

It has been an annual tradition for the Rancho to host this event in honor of the community and all of its supporters, including major financial contributors as the Knights of Columbus. Part of the funds are intended to go to the restoration and relocation of the statues of San Antonio and the child that were vandalized last year.

500 YEARS OF CHRISTIANITY IN THE PHILIPPINES CELEBRATION

The Knights of Columbus Color Corps have participated in two Callouts marking the celebration of 500 years of Christianity in the Philippines.

The St. Catherine of Siena Church in Reseda, CA held its celebration on March 20, 2021 with the inclusion of a Sinulog Procession from the Church to the school and a symbolic handing-over of the Sto. Niño Statue and cross to the native Filipinos. A similar celebration was held at the Incarnation Church in Glendale, CA where a procession of offerings and performers danced their way from the Church entrance to the altar, followed by the Our Lady of Manaoag statue and flanked by the honorable presence of the Knights of Columbus Color Guards.

The historical event earmarks the landing and colonization of the Philippines by Spain, led by the famed Portuguese Explorer Ferdinand Magellan on March 16, 1521 in Limasawa, Cebu, highlighted by a Mass and baptism of the first Filipino converts to Christianity.

The 500th. year of Christianity in the Philippines Celebrations have been heralded by several Catholic Filipinos and foreigners alike around the world. Its inseparable attach-

ment to Philippine culture and history is beyond just a significant event but has become a mark the Filipino Catholic's faith.

Subsequent voyages to the Philippines followed which include the voyage of Garcia Jofre de Loaisa in 1525 to Surigao, Visayas and Mindanao, Alvaro de Saavedra in 1527 to

Mindanao, Ruy Lopez de Villalobos in 1542 to Samar, Leyte and Sarrangani and Migule Lopez de Legaspi in 1565 to Cebu.

The original cross carried by Magellan's ships is said to be housed in a Chapel next to the Basilica de Santo Niño in Cebu City where original Santo Niño image resides to this day.

Ferdinand Magellan later died from a later battle against Lapu Lapu a local chief (Datu) of Mactan in the Visayas.

Magellan's remaining crew continued their voyage back to Spain and were credited with being the first to ever circumnavigate the world.
